

The true extent of Niko's generosity and kindness became evident as I walked to the cab of his truck and was surprised to find his wife and two small children! As a family, they were willing to put their life on hold to help a complete stranger. As we traveled 222 S, it was comforting to see "Trish B" show up on my phone. Thanks Trish for again checking on my safety in true TRLR spirit.

My boyfriend, Jim, met us at Sports 'N Turf and helped Niko, Terri, and I unload. Afterward, Niko would again not take anything for his efforts so I slipped back to the truck and thanked his wife for their kindness. Reaching out for her hand I insisted she take the rolled-up bills and said treat

Niko and the kids to something special – then quickly walked away before she could refuse. Jim drove me home and I waved goodbye to Terri at the 283/30 split.

I will probably never hear from Niko again but there is one thing I now know for sure... never give up HOPE! My faith in mankind has been renewed. Niko and his family were a godsend that day. Yes, I could have

called AMA to arrange for towing and wait over an hour for a tow truck to arrive, but that was not in the cards that day. I completely believe that Niko and I were meant to cross paths, renewing both our souls with the reward of helping someone in need. Niko, I will think of you and your family and definitely "pay it forward" every chance I get.

P.S. The doc at the Sports 'N Turf Spyder 'hospital' diagnosed SilverFox with a bad voltage regulator, and, after a successful surgery and some recovery time, had him up & running 4 days later. Just in time to be off to another wonderful TRLR ride.
