# Influential Women in Motorcycling History

#### By Lynn

March is Women In History month and a great opportunity to celebrate significant contributions women have made to motorcycling. Below are a few ladies who have played important roles in paving the way for us. With the exception of Effie and Avis Hotchkiss, all are members of the AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame.



#### Dorothy (Dot) Robinson (born 1912)

- Co-founded the original all-female motorcycle club, the Motor Maids of America, with her friend Linda Dugeau
- First woman to win an AMA national event (1940)
- Known as the "First Lady of Motorcycling"
- Her infamous pink touring Harley-Davidson is in the HD museum in Milwaukee





#### Linda Dugeau (born 1913)

- In 1940, co-founded the oldest motorcycling organization for women in North America, the Motor Maids of America, with her friend Dot Robinson
- Worked as a motorcycle courier and had a reputation as one of the best female off-road riders in the 1950s
- Rode an old Harley-Davidson JD when she was a 19-year-old Wellesley College student

## Linda "Jo" Giovannoni

• Motorcycle journalist and rider who cofounded *Harley Women* magazine, the first national motorcycling publication devoted to women motorcycle enthusiasts (1985)



• Featured in the book "Hear Me Roar" by Ann Ferrar



### **Cristine Sommer-Simmons**

- In 1985 co-founded Harley Women, considered the first widely distributed magazine for women riders
- Active in promoting motorcycling as an author, columnist, songwriter and motorcycle journalist
- Authored the book The American Motorcycle Girls 1900-1950
- Honored Effie Hotchkiss by riding Effie's 1915 Harley-Davidson V-twin across American in the 2010 Motorcycle Cannonball

### Hazel Kolb

- Dubbed the "Motorcyclin' Grandma,"
- Known for her 1979 perimeter ride around the U.S. on an Electra Glide to honor her late husband, Jack
- Her tireless promotion of motorcycling helped break down the stereotypical image many had about motorcyclists





#### Gloria Tramontin-Struck (born 1925)

- Original member of the Motor Maids of America
- Owned 14 bikes that she has ridden in the 48 contiguous states several times over
- Started riding at age 16, and rode for 75 years

#### Theresa Wallach (born 1909)

- 1935 rode from London to Cape Town, South Africa, crossing the Sahara Desert, reportedly without a compass
- First Vice President of Women's International Motorcycle Association in 1950
- 1970 published Easy Motorcycle Riding training manual
- 1973 Founded Easy Motorcycle Riding Schools, Inc.





#### Augusta Van Buren (born 1892) Adeline Van Buren (born 1894)

- First women to ride solo motorcycles across the US (1916 on Indian Power Plus motorcycles) with the mission to prove that women can ride as well as men
- First women to ride motorized vehicles of any kind to the summit of Pikes Peak
- First women to make the transcontinental journey on two solo motorcycles
- Decedents of Martin Van Buren, 8th President of the United States



#### Effie & Avis Hotchkiss

- 1915 first female motorcycle riders (mother and daughter) to successfully complete a transcontinental ride across the U.S
- Effie (daughter) taught herself to ride and handle repairs then added a sidecar so that Avis (mother) could join her in her riding adventures



My son Michael is 30 in April, he has a wife Amanda, and they have two beautiful daughters, Callie who is 2, and Kailynn who


